UNCLAIMED PROPERTY

- Stop by my office and see if you have Unclaimed Property!
- Unclaimed Property can include:
 - Closed bank accounts
 - Uncashed checks (including paychecks)
 - Lost stocks and bonds
 - Contents of safe deposit boxes
 - Life insurance policies
 - Expired gift cards/gift certificates

PROPERTY TAX/ RENT REBATE PROGRAM

- Eligible homeowners and renters can receive a rebate ranging from \$380 to \$1,000. The amount of funds you will receive is based on your income. Call my office at 717-627-0036 to find out if you qualify and to schedule an appointment.
- Eligibility Requirements
 - Pennsylvanian age 65 and older
 - Widows and widowers age 50 and older
 - People with disabilities age 18 and older on limited income

RED ROSE TRANSIT AND SEPTA SENIOR FARE CARD

If you are 65 years or older, you are eligible to apply for Red Rose Transit's Senior Free Ride Program and SEPTA Senior Fare Card through my office. The process is simple and takes less than 15 minutes. We can also process renewal SEPTA applications if you have an old or expired card. No appointment is necessary, but proof of age is required. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

POLICY WIN!

An important issue affecting everyone across the Commonwealth is the rapid growth of Artificial Intelligence (AI). This session, I was proud to introduce SB 1034, which would require mandated reporters to report cases where a minor uses AI to generate sexually explicit deepfake images of another child. Language from SB 1034 was included in the 2026-27 School Code Bill as part of this year's state budget. ▲

SENIOR AFFORDABILITY POLICY HEARING

The 36th District has a large population of older adults, which makes affordability for seniors one of my primary focuses. On June 12, 2026, I invited Senator Miller and the Senate Policy Committee to our district for a policy hearing on “Addressing Rising Costs for Seniors” at Elizabethtown Community Housing and Outreach Services (ECHOS). Testifiers included the Pennsylvania Department of Aging, the Office of the Northampton County Executive, ECHOS, LeadingAge PA, Meals on Wheels, and AARP. Together, we discussed the many challenges facing today's older adults in the district and across the Commonwealth. My goal was to provide lawmakers with a clearer understanding of the issues this population faces, as well as the concerns of the providers who serve them. ▲

DATA CENTERS

The Senate is considering two bills I support that would let municipalities temporarily pause new data center applications so local leaders can gather community input, review zoning, consult experts, and chart a responsible path forward. These bills don't mandate moratoriums; they simply give communities time to update zoning and ensure development reflects local needs.

At the same time, Harrisburg must address utility affordability, with power bills up nearly 50% in recent years. Data centers' massive electricity demand drives costly grid expansions, and too often these companies avoid paying their fair share through subsidized rates and specialized contracts. I've been working with my colleagues on finding ways to regulate these agreements and making sure money goes back into your pockets. Governor Shapiro's GRID standards also push data center developers to add new electric capacity, improve transparency, and protect both Pennsylvanians and the environment. ▲

HUNTING AND TRAPPING EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS

SB 1418 would provide that the Pennsylvania Department of Education work in consultation with the Pennsylvania Game Commission to develop an age-appropriate hunting and trapping education program for grades 6 through 12. The House companion to my bill, introduced by Representative Anita Kulik, passed the House with bipartisan support. ▲

Red Light Enforcement (ARLE) program. This funding will allow the township to upgrade traffic signals and pedestrian facilities.

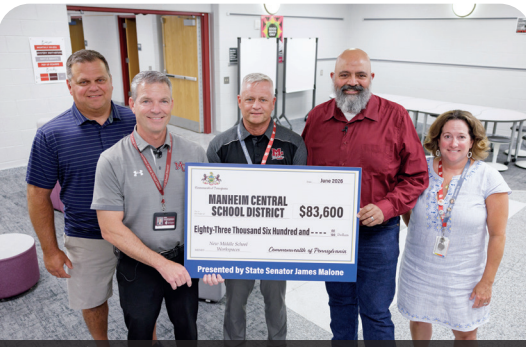
Marietta Borough received more than

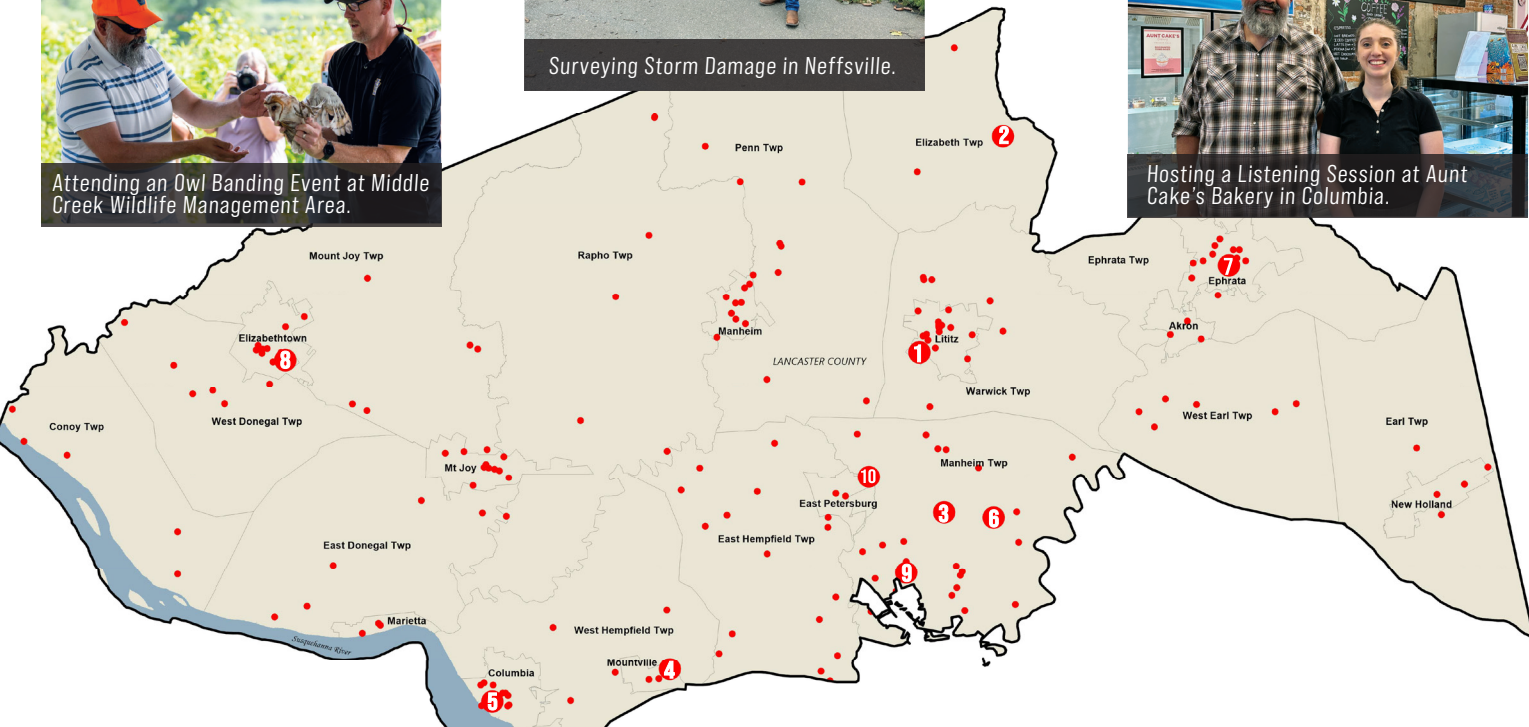
